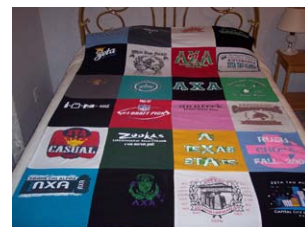

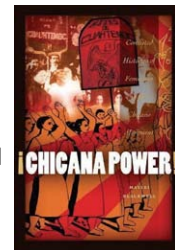
Gender Buffet is a weekly event held at the Women's Center every Friday from 12:00-1:30 P.M. This event is based on discussion, rather than presentation or lecture, around various topics within the framework of gender and social justice. Light snacks are provided as well. The discussions have been mostly facilitated by the Gender Buffet and programming intern at the Women's Center. On occasion, we have guests who facilitate or co-facilitate the discussion; in some cases faculty members or members of organizations who can provide insights and information around a topic they are knowledgeable about. Participation on average is about 15-20 students each week. To ensure a safe and open space for everyone, ground rules are established and agreed upon by the group so everyone can feel safe and confident to participate and engage in discussion while listening to various different perspectives.
