Gender Buffet: Gender&Sexual Orientation



In celebration of the 10th anniversary of the Rainbow Newsletter, a memorable event from the past will be highlighted every week.

Ten vears ago. on June 5th, Lee Badgett, professor of Economics at the University of Massachusetts , Amherst, spoke on the economic lives of lesbians and gay men. Lee Badgett is a labor economist who focuses on race, gender, and sexual orientation in the labor market. Her

past research projects include an analysis of the effect of ending affirmative action in public sector employment in California, a survey on giving and volunteering in the lesbian, gay, and bisexual communities. and the economic impact of allowing samesex couples to marry.
