


# UCSD LGBT Undergraduate Scholarships: Essay Writing Workshop


LGBT Resource Center Writing Workshop: March 6 | 6:00 p.m. Due March 16 | 4:00 p.m.



Rooted in a practice of interdependency, this year's conference "Collide, Connect, Create" invests in the opportunities generated when we engage in each other's struggles and needs, share



"Smile for the Camera" is a photography exhibition of gender-based street harassment that women and LGBTQIA folk face in their lives. "Street harassment is any action or comment between strangers in public places that is disrespectful, unwelcome, threatening and/or harassing and is motivated by gender" (<a href="www.streetharassment.org">www.streetharassment.org</a>). Participants are encouraged to respond to street harassment by taking a picture to document their experience. The camera lens can be

a defense mechanism used to influence actions and behavior of the harasser who loses some sense of autonomy upon realizing that he or she is a visible object.
